Ulster Wildlife is supportive of a sustainable economy but has concerns around the concept of growth where that involves the consumption of more natural resources and increased pollution.

We are supportive of job creation and incentivisation of emerging industries that support 'nature-based solutions' for mitigating the effects of climate change and enhancing biodiversity. Peatland restoration is one such area where significant employment can be focused on restoring nature and reducing NI's emissions. The work Ulster Wildlife has done on the reintroduction of native oysters has demonstrated the valuable role of restoring natural processes that, when scaled up, can help with water quality through filtration and coastal erosion through the formation of biogenic reefs. Through habitat and species conservation we can provide ecosystem services which support sustainable development goals. These rely on skill individuals trained in regionally specific work areas.

Careful consideration needs to be given to the Environmental Principles Policy Statement as well as other strategies, such as Green Growth and EIP to ensure alignment.

Whilst we recognise the significance of the issues around Lough Neagh, we do not agree with the hierarchy of the title. Lough Neagh is part of the wider Northern Ireland environment and there are many significant issues that need to be addressed. The degradation of Lough Neagh highlights the negative impacts that have resulted from decades of a lack of regulation and management in our environment. This crisis is not limited to Lough Neagh but impacts but NI's freshwater and marine environment. The PfG should consider the broader water quaitly crisis in both land and sea.

Ulster Wildlife welcomes any positive actions for the environment, but we do not believe those listed in the PfG are ambitious enough. The Environmental Improvement Plan (EIP) and Climate Action Plan (CAP) are listed as achievements, but both are statutory requirements that have been published later than their deadline. The Nature Recovery Strategy remains overdue and is not referenced in the documents (but is referred to in the EIP). The PfG lacks commitment to crucial goals such as the 30x30 target to protect 30% of land and sea by 2030, as well as the integration of natural capital into policy-making, which are vital for a sustainable, resilient economy. There is a need for additional strong, measurable biodiversity targets to be enshrined in law and for actions within the Programme for Government to address biodiversity loss. The inclusion of the word 'Environment' as an afterthought to Lough Neagh suggests that broader environmental matters are not high enough on the Executive's agenda.

We would also advocate for the formation of an independent Environmental Protection Agency.

Agri-environment schemes are one of the major areas for environmental delivery due to the scale of land use (over 75%). These rely on public sector administration processes for their delivery. At their peak, agri-environment schemes were delivered to over 12,000 farms and covered 40% of NI land area. However, the current EFS only covers 6% and has fewer than 5,000 farms engaged. One of the major barriers to scheme delivery is the administration, which is proving costly, with up to 40% of total scheme costs in some years being attributed to scheme administration.

A radical rethink of efficiency, cultural change of innovation, and focus on technology is required to scale up delivery of agri-environment schemes. However, in parallel, the farmers that need to access these schemes require an element of direct and face-to-face support to transition to online processes, and this too has been gradually withdrawn from DAERA Direct offices. Where public services cannot meet these demands, consideration to less expensive and more effective outsourcing should be considered.

As stated in OEP's recent report on the Drivers and Pressures affecting nature in Northern Ireland, planning and development are negatively impacting our environment by increasing pollution pressure and causing habitat loss and fragmentation. The Planning System needs be reviewed to make sure it properly protects the environment and furthermore enhances it. We'd advocate for an approach with similar ambitions to that of Biodiversity Net Gain (BNG) in England, reconsideration of what is seen as 'permitted development' as well as better and more consistently recognition the role of Local Nature designations (SLNCI, Wildlife Sites, etc.).

All developments, but especially infrastructure projects such as those managing water (for both pollution and flooding) should embrace 'Nature-based solutions' (NbS) and incorporate green and blue infrastructure in preference to hard engineering solutions, such as the use of buffer strips along water courses, the use of trees and natural flood plains to reduce flooding impacts and incorporating habitat recovery to reduce costal erosion. Similarly, NbS can be used to achieve net zero through the sensitive management and restoration of carbon sequestering habitats which include woodlands, peatlands, and saltmarsh among others.

We also rely on people and a healthy and prosperous society to value these habitats and to manage and enjoy their many benefits. As per previous responses, we advocate the role of Nature-based solutions (NbS) as a multi-faceted approach to creating jobs, contributing solutions to carbon emissions, pollution and flooding, whilst simultaneously delivering biodiversity gains.

We would like to see more emphasis on the environment in this section, particularly around green jobs and opportunities for training and upskilling in these areas. This should be of at least equal importance to the agri-food and food security ambition outlined.

We support the Making Life Better and Live Better initiatives and would advocate a leading role for nature and access to greenspace as relatively inexpensive and effective measures for physical and mental health. Where people do not have direct access to green spaces and nature, these should be created as a priority in these areas.

We advocate strongly for the Planet Mission and would support more Nature-based Solutions applied to deliver on the actions. A healthy, resilient natural system has an important role in providing ecosystem services which will mitigate against global climate change and biodiversity loss. We must recognise the transboundary nature of our land and sea environment, particularly our shared sea loughs and the international commitments to nature conservation.

A focus on the Biodiversity/Nature Recovery Strategy is missing from this list, which needs to be added and prioritized, in addition to 30x30 targets and enshrining nature targets in law (as carbon emissions reductions have been).

Just Transition funding and support is key, particularly for highly impacted sectors such as agriculture and fisheries. It is important to ensure agriculture and fisheries have a sustainable future and can be supported through a period of change to ensure the industries can deliver the right public goods as well as the right types of food with a low environmental footprint, taking an ecosystem approach to production.
